The Slovenian Institute of Adult Education (SIAE) is the central public institute and umbrella institution for adult education in the Republic of Slovenia which was founded by ordinance on establishment on 27 September 1991.

The fundamental purpose of our operations is to develop the field of adult education in line with the Resolution on the Master Plan for Adult Education in the Republic of Siovenia for 2013–2020 and other national and European strategic documents and development guidelines on adult education. Our powers and responsibilities are also stipulated in the statutory provisions governing education, principally the Organization and Financing of Education Act and the Adult Education Act (2018).

Since 2012, our role has also been that of the national coordinator of the European Agenda for Adult Learning (EEAL). By working on various research, programmes and projects and events, we participate in the development of the culture of lifelong learning and more specifically the culture of adult education. We inform both the domestic and international professional and broader public about our work.

We establish ties with both policy-makers on the national and international levels and other adult education and pedagogy practitioners as well as coordinators and participants of various projects, adult education institutions and learners in Slovenia and beyond. We work actively as part of international organisations in all areas of our operation.

We prepare and Implement more than 40 educational programmes for around 800 participants, adult educators per year. The basis for the successful inclusion of participants into our programmes is formed by the research and development projects that are well-received both at home and abroad (link). We work on increasing the accessibility of education for educationally disadvantaged adults (link). In doing so, we develop the foundations to support learning and continuously upgrade our educational programmes in terms of quality. We contribute to the broader awareness of the accessibility and importance of lifelong learning and non-formal learning that boost an individual's quality of life and improve education as a whole.

Awareness-raising

We began our efforts of building the awareness about the importance, role and forms of adult education and lifelong learning in 1996 with the project entitled Teden vseživljenjskega učenja (Lifelong Learning Week). Over the years, the building of awareness of all spheres of the public has become a recognised and indispensable activity that manifests itself in different ways. Its success is predicated on the participation of various stakeholders, i.e. from the political, academic and professional to the non-professional spheres and the media. One of the key guiding principles is that we work not only for others but also with them.

Through these activities, we:

- broaden the awareness about the necessity of learning in all stages of life and of its presence in all circumstances of life;
- contribute to the broadest possible understanding of adult education as a driving force behind lifelong advancement of knowledge and skills, improvement of employability, personal growth and coexistence in communities;
- promote inquisitiveness and a positive attitude towards learning as well as change the established (mis)conceptions of its (in)accessibility;
- reach vulnerable groups and other adults and inspire them to engage in adult education and lifelong learning;
- contribute to the voice of the learners becoming increasingly heard and observed in the designing of the policy and the educational offer

We realise the above through the promotional campaign entitled Teden vseživljenjskega učenja (Lifelong Learning Week) (TVU; 1996 →), the Priznanja za promocijo učenja in znanja odraslih (SIAE Awards for the Promotion of Adult Learning and Knowledge) (Priznanja ACS; 1997 →) and the Zgledi vlečejo (Role Models Attract) multimedia portal (ZV; 2012 →). We therefore organise domestic and international events where we participate with our own contributions. The more notable among these are the traditional Andragoški kolokvij (Adult Education Colloquium) (1997 →) and the Letni posvet o izobraževanju odraslih (Annual Adult Education Conference) (2010 →) events. We promote the activities and achievements in various media, especially online media and social networks. We publish and disseminate various promotional materials.

We build on the synergistic action at home by transferring our knowledge and experience to the international arena where we are recognised as one of the first and most active members of the international movement for the promotion of adult education and lifelong learning. We use this experience as the basis for coordinating the Implementation of the European Agenda for Adult Learning (the EAAL project) in Slovenia, which we have been doing since 2012 on the national level. We also take part in other European projects dealing with awareness-building.

AIM

The project is almed at popularisation of messages of the updated European Agenda for Adult Learning (EAAL) and of educational policies on the national and European level, focusing especially on raising awareness of the Slovenian public on importance and ubiquity of adult education and lifelong education and on opportunities available to the adult population. The focus is on acquisition of basic skills and other key competences for adults. The project is part of various endeavours of EU members under the guidance of the European Commission to implement as much of the strategic guidelines of the new action plan for adult learning as possible and to bring it closer to all parts of the public.

DESCRIPTION

The project activities are a continuation of the project Implementation of the renewed EAAL 2014-2015 in Slovenia, whose main achievements were the Learning parade and the professional EAAL 2015 event for promotion of development of basic competences in four target groups - the young, the unemployed, immigrants and the rural population. In 2016, the professional EAAL events will be upgraded.

Four of seven events will still target the above mentioned educationally deprived groups, but three of them will focus on acquisition of key competences to improve employability of three target groups: the young unemployed, the long-term unemployed and the employed, in all cases focusing on adults with low level of education/qualifications. The conclusions and recommendations will be presented by event holders at the final events.

The project addresses all target groups: the representatives of adult education politics, practice and profession; the learners; the media; the general public; and especially the less educated and educationally deprived.

The EAAL Project paves the Upskilling Pathways – New opportunities for adults

The overarching goal of the planned activities for the project implementation of the European Agenda for Adult Learning (EAAL) in Slovenia in the 2017-2019 period is to popularise the EU Council Recommendation Upskilling Pathways: New Opportunities for Adults (hereinafter UP) and to support its systematic implementation. With this initiative, the Council Invited the member countries to give adults – employed, unemployed or economically inactive – the opportunity for a fresh start. The planned activities should be based on mechanisms for definition of knowledge and skills the adults already possess, they should enable personalised education and training and help the learners acquire new knowledge, skills and qualifications. Supporting activities such as guidance, outreach, awareness raising, etc. play an important role in this endeavour.



The first EAAL consultation - a conferenced entitled Challenges and opportunities of educating for a longer working period (in Slovenian) - was based not only on the UP initiative but also on the Slovenian Strategy for Long-lived Society (2017). The focus was on two UP topics: creation of suitable programmes for adults with low education and supporting activity - outreach. The event targeted mainly older (employed) adults with the purpose of offering them education and training to maintain their current working status.

How the experience of refugees touches our lives ... How should educators respond?

The consultation of the Andragogic Association of Slovenia (Andragoško društvo Slovenije – ADS) on 13 February brought together individuals and institutions who work with migrants and refugees as part of their job, on a project basis, as activists or as volunteers. The aim of the event was to arrive at a more detailed definition of the problem, which would allow us to understand it better and perhaps provide the answer to the question of how can the educators contribute to a solution. The data of the UN Refugee Agency (UNCHR) published in the document Global Trends – Forced Displacement in 2016 shows that this problem is still a pressing one.

At the end, we showed a video prepared by the SIAE as part of the EAAL project which shows the opinions and experiences of adult educators who work with immigrants and the Roma people.

The role of adult education in increasingly recognised among employers

Through the activities of the fourth phase of the EAAL project, we support the implementation of the European Council Recommendation Upskilling Pathways – New Opportunities for Adults. During the three EAAL consultation meetings, the last one was held in Ljubljana at the entrepreneurial breakfast entitled Does assessment of knowledge and skills development lead to more satisfied employees and employers? (in Slovenian), we have gathered stakeholders from different fields, mainly from the fields of adult education and the economy.

The Annual Adult Education Conference that was held on 23 and 24 October in Maribor intertwined interesting topics with three outstanding pinnacles. The first one was delivered by Dr Vesna Vuk Godina who gave an impressive lecture about knowledge as the greatest value. During the second one we were nicely lulled in the evening by Ditka and Gorazd Čepin with Feri Lainšček. The third pinnacle event was a panel on the integration of elderly men into the community. The extensive programme and informative speakers were aptly maneuvered by Zvonka Pangerc Pahernik, MSc.

The final contributions related to the integration within the project EAAL. Zvonka Pangerc Pahernik, MSc, the coordinator of the project in Slovenia summarised the background, funding and associated key events in 2018 with EU initiative, called Upskilling Pathways. We heard brief presentations from two EAAL consulting events, organised by the SIAE in cooperation with Association of Educational and Guidance Centres of Slovenia and Society of organisations for adult education at Secondary Schools.
