Overview of the Adult Education System

Slovenia has a well-developed and inclusive adult education system that strives to align with both national strategies and European guidelines.

Key characteristics:

- Comprehensive legal framework (e.g., Adult Education Act, 2018)
- Publicly co-funded and quality-assured provision
- Strong partnership model involving public institutions, NGOs, and social partners

Governance and Institutional Framework

- Ministry of Education, Science and Sport: Leads policy development and funding for general adult education and lifelong learning.
- Ministry of Labour, Family, Social Affairs and Equal Opportunities: Responsible for labour market training, social inclusion programmes, and retraining of the unemployed.
- SIAE: National development and research institution for adult education; provides professional support and coordinates national programmes and initiatives.
- Public educational institutions, such as folk high schools, NGOs, and private providers play a crucial role in the implementation and delivery of adult education.

Resolution on the Adult Education Master Plan in the Republic of Slovenia

A strategic document that defines objectives, target groups, umbrella indicators and priority areas, measures and indicators:

Objectives of the ReAEMP22-30:

- 1. Increase the participation of adults in LLL.;
- 2. Raise the level of basic skills and improve the general educational attainment of adults;
- 3. Raise the educational attainment of adults;
- 4. Increase the skills of the population to respond successfully to labour market needs;
- 5. Strengthen research and development in the field of adult education;
- 6. Improve and strengthen adult learning activities.

Target Groups

- Adults with low levels of basic skills, regardless of employment status, age or other characteristics;
- Adults who need to improve their general educational attainment to meet personal needs and community challenges;
- Adults in need of further vocational or professional education or training in line with labour market needs;
- Young adults, early school leavers and school drop-outs;
- Elderly (65+) and
- Adults who have limited opportunities to access social, cultural, economic and educational goods.

Umbrella indicators of ReAEMP22–30

1. From the Active and Non-active Population Survey (LFS4t)

In Slovenia, the participation of the population aged 25 to 64 in LLL will increase from 8.4 % in 2020 to 19 % in 2030.

2. From the Adult Education Survey (AES)

In Slovenia, the participation of the population aged 25 to 64 in LLL will increase from 46 % in 2016 to 66 % in 2030.

3. From the Active and Non-active Population Survey (LFS12m)


In Slovenia, the participation of the population aged 25 to 64 in LLL will increase from the calculated value 40.3% in 2016 to 60% in 2030.

Priority Areas, Measures and Indicators


- 1. General non-formal adult education,
